Submission of articles and applications

Articles for publication and participants' applications for the Round Table are sent **to the above-mentioned email address** (with the note **“Belarus and China — 2026”** by **March 18, 2026**).

The file name must include the author's last name and initials, city (where the represented organization is based), research area number, for example: **Ivanov_VN_Baranovichi_2**.

One author can submit **no more than two** articles, including those written in collaboration.

The publication of the collected papers subsequent to the results of the round table is scheduled **after** the event in the form of a printed edition, **participants of the round table will be provided with an electronic copy of the original edition (pdf format) via email**.

We inform you that the collected papers subsequent to the results of the round table will be placed in the open access archive (repository) of BarSU. Indexing in RSCI is provided.

Authors' articles **are published free of charge**.

Transportation, catering, and accommodation expenses for roundtable participants shall be covered by their sending organizations.

Articles that do not correspond to the topics of the round table, formatting requirements, or those sent after the deadline, will not be considered and will not be returned.

The editorial board conducts an independent (closed) expert evaluation of submitted articles and carries out additional peer review. No discussion is held on issues of rejection. Authors shall bear responsible for submitting to the editorial office any manuscripts that have already been published or accepted for publication by other editorial offices.

Authors bear full legal responsibility for all information provided in the publication. At the same time, authors are personally responsible for the inadmissibility of using in the texts of articles information from printed sources, books, informational products, informational resources included in the Republican List of Extremist Content (<http://mininform.gov.by/documents/respublikanskiy-spisok-ekstremistskikh-materialov/>), as well as those posted on internet resources, in online publications, access to which is restricted by legislative acts and/or court decisions.

The research paper is published preserving the author's spelling and punctuation, so it must be thoroughly prepared, proofread, and should not contain spelling, punctuation, and grammatical mistakes.



Requirements for article formatting

1. Technical design of articles.

Articles must be prepared in MS Word. The article length should be **10,000—12,000** characters (including spaces) of the author's original material (this count includes the text, tables, list of cited sources, and figures); page size — **A5**; first line indent — **0.6 cm**; margins: top — **1.8 cm**; bottom — **2.2 cm**; inside — **1.7 cm**; outside — **1.9 cm**.

Pages should not be numbered. Page orientation — portrait only; the use of automatic endnotes and regular footnotes in the article is not permitted; hyphenation is not permitted; the text must be in Times New Roman font; main text font size — **11 pt**, auxiliary text (information about the author, list of cited sources, figure captions, table titles and contents) font size — **9 pt**; line spacing — **single**.

2. Content and Formatting of Mandatory Elements:

– **Universal Decimal Classification (UDC/YDK) index:** mandatory; placed on a separate line, aligned left, preceding the author details; regular (light) font weight, 9 pt.

– **information about the authors:**

- initials and last name (in the nominative case, bold font, 9 pt);
- place of work/study (the **official name of the educational institution or scientific organization must be given in full according to the institution/organization charter**, place of the institution's location, italic, 9 pt);

- city/town, country (full official name, italic, 9 pt);

- e-mail for contact.

The names of the article co-authors must be given in the order they have accepted.

Information about the authors must be provided in the language of the article and placed before the article title, highlighted using appropriate typographic formatting;

– **title:** centered before the text, in uppercase letters (11 pt), bold; must be in the language of the main text;

– **abstract:** must reflect the main content of the article and research results; length: 50 to 100 words; 9 pt;

– **keywords** (3—5): should convey the main semantic content; separated by semicolons; 9 pt.

The English version of the author details, title, abstract, and keywords must be grammatically correct and fully convey the Russian version;

– **main text:** justified alignment, regular font weight; authors should highlight necessary sections in bold (**Introduction, Body, Conclusion**);

– **tables:** table titles placed on a separate line aligned left, without indent; continuous numbering using Arabic numerals; even if there is only one table, it must be numbered (T a b l e 1 — Table Title); all tables must be referenced in the text, when referencing, write the word “Table” followed by the number, *tables must not be inserted as images*;

– **formulas:** all formulas, including all Greek alphabet symbols and other characters used within them, must be created using the MathType formula editor; font size 11 pt.; variables denoted by Latin letters should be italicized, Greek letters — upright; mathematical signs and abbreviated mathematical terms should be set in upright type; abbreviations in subscripts/superscripts (in Russian) should be typed in upright font; all brackets — in upright type; the formula number should be enclosed in parentheses and aligned to the right margin on the same line as the formula; only formulas referenced in the text need to be numbered; when defining variables, they must be listed in the order they appear in the formula;

– **figures**: inserted into the text as embedded objects without wrapping; graphs and diagrams prepared in MS Excel **must be in grayscale, color figures and diagrams are not allowed!!!**; continuous numbering using Arabic numerals, an em-dash follows the number, followed by the caption (Figure 1 — Figure Title); figure caption — placed below, centered without paragraph indent; even if there is only one figure, it must be numbered; each figure must be referenced in the text using the full word “Figure” followed by the number. If an illustration numbered as one item contains multiple images, the subject of each may be specified in the caption as follows:

Figure 12 — Design of the end page: *a* — page with a plot ending; *b* — page with an ornamental ending

Numerical and letter designations explained in the main caption and in the legend are highlighted in italics.

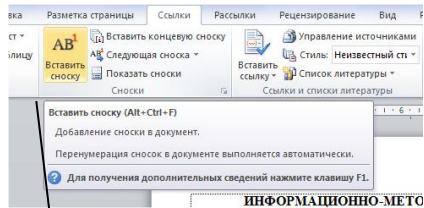
The same result must not be presented as both an illustration and a table;

– **pre-article bibliographic lists**: SOURCES MUST BE LISTED IN THE ORDER OF CITATION APPEARANCE, NOT ALPHABETICALLY; title the section “List of Cited Sources” and number using Arabic numerals followed by a period with a paragraph indent; format in full compliance with STB 7.1-2024 “Bibliographic Record. Bibliographic Description. General Requirements and Rules for Compilation”. In-text citations must be enclosed in square brackets: indicate the source number, followed by a comma and the page number where the cited text is located ([1, p. 30]; [2, p. 80; 5, p. 112]).

3. When typing the main text, the following must be ensured: 1) non-breaking spaces between the last name and initials, as well as between common abbreviations, such as *et. al.*, *V. A. Ivanov*; 2) hyphen signs (“-“), minus (“-“) and dash (“—“).

In Russian, use quotes in the form of chevrons («chevrons»), in English: double quotation marks (“quotation marks”), in German: German quotes („German quotes“), in French: chevrons with spacing (« chevrons with spacing »).

In foreign words, the apostrophe should be typed as a comma (country's).
